Symptoms of hearing and/or listening problems related to Auditory Processing Disorder (APD):

No	Difficulty following spoken directions unless they are brief and simple
No	Difficulty attending to and remembering spoken information
No	Slowness in processing spoken information
No	Difficulty understanding in the presence of other sounds
No	Being overwhelmed by complex or "busy" auditory environments
	(e.g. classrooms, shopping malls, etc.)
No	Undue sensitivity to loud sounds or noise
No	Poor listening skills
No	Preference for loud television or music volume
No	Insensitivity to tone of voice or other nuances of speech

Other risk factors for Auditory Processing Disorder (APD):
